LIGHTING OF THE FOURTH ADVENT CANDLE

From Prepare: An Advent Devotional, Bethany Fellows/Chalice Press, (c)2019

Matthew 1:20 – But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit."

God calls Joseph into the deep vulnerability of love. To love Mary in this moment will require trust, risk and the sacrifice of pride. To love the baby in her belly, the catalyst for uninvited upheaval in his life, will require humility, gentleness and habitual generosity. This is the kind of love we prepare to practice during Advent: to embrace this coming child, who will bring both upheaval and meaning to <u>our</u> existence; and to re-orient ourselves toward *trust, risk* and the *sacrifice of pride*. Let us pray that as we approach Bethlehem, the love of God will grow in us, that we may share that love with a hurting world.

We read together:

We light this candle, the fourth candle of Advent, thankful for the light of love in our lives. May that light grow in us as we prepare to welcome the Christ child.

Let us pray: Loving God, help us to love you and your children with the vulnerability and passion with which you have loved us. **Amen.**

READING – Micah 5:2-5a

But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah, who are one of the little clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient days. Therefore he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labor has brought forth; then the rest of his kindred shall return to the people of Israel. And he shall stand and feed his flock in the strength of the Lord, in the majesty of the name of the Lord his God. And they shall live secure, for now he shall be great to the ends of the earth, and he shall be the one of peace.

RESPONSIVE READING – Luke 1:46-55

"My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior,

for he has looked with favor on the lowly state of his servant. Surely from now on all generations will call me blessed,

for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name;

indeed, his mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation.

He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts.

He has brought down the powerful from their thrones and lifted up the lowly;

he has filled the hungry with good things and sent the rich away empty.

He has come to the aid of his child Israel, in remembrance of his mercy,

according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants forever."

READING – Hebrews 10:5-10

Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said, "Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body you have prepared for me; in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure.

Then I said, 'See, I have come to do your will, O God' (in the scroll of the book it is written of me)." When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), then he added, "See, I have come to do your will." He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.
