LIGHTING OF THE SECOND ADVENT CANDLE

Matthew 3:3: Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.

The season of Advent brings the chaos of *planning* and *doing*. As we prepare to receive the Christ child, give us eyes to see the brokenness and chaos of the world – and the courage not to turn away from its pain. Give us the desire to see in the brokenness the holy potential for the kingdom of God. Let this time slow so that we might be able to cultivate a sense of gratitude, a practice of peace, and a response to the call to be peacemakers in a broken world.

On this Second Sunday of Advent, we light the second candle of Advent, as people who long for peace. May we prepare the path for the Prince of Peace to enter into our midst.

READING - Malachi 3:1-4

See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight – indeed, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like washers' soap; he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the Lord in righteousness. Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord, as in the days of old and as in former years.
